FROM THE DESK OF FR. VITO Greetings parishioners and dear friends of St. Patrick's Church





As I was displaying one of my Nativity Scenes in the Rectory Office, I unwrapped one of my favourite pieces: the sleeping shepherd. These particular figurines are extremely old, close to two centuries.

They are made of clay, and most of them have marks of the age. I have often spoken of the "sleeping shepherd", but it is important for me to remember and communicate to those who may not have heard my explanation previously. As a child I reflected on this image as the "tired" shepherd, resting from his labour. As an adult, and a priest, I see much more in this image. While the rest of the scene is focused upon the miracle of the Birth of the Saviour, this shepherd is "asleep", "unaware" of the marvels of God's grace surrounding him. I often think of myself and some of us who may remain unaware at times of God's work and blessings in our life. The Advent season invites us to "stay awake" and "be attentive"; "be ready" to recognize his presence and welcome him when grace knocks at our doors. May this be our Advent wish and prayer for each other: let us arise from our sleep and see, welcome and rejoice in the beauty, love and grace of God's presence within us and round us. HAPPY ADVENT.
