IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING CHURCH ATTENDANCE

Cardinal Collins has mandated that as of this coming Tuesday, November 24, all celebrations in churches within the Toronto, Peel and York Regions (in the Red Zone – including our church) will be restricted to 50 participants. Please note that our church too will ONLY ACCOMMODATE 50 worshippers, in the main body of the church, and NO WHERE ELSE IN THE BUILDING.

Please remember to ALWAYS disinfect your hands when you enter. ALWAYS wear a mask and keep the required distance. **Only 3 people per designated pew.** Only people who live in the same household can sit together.

PARISH ADVENT COMMUNITY ROSARY


Beginning on Saturday, November 28th, our entire parish community is invited to join in a weekly praying of the Rosary. It will be

Vito will hand out to you. From JANUARY 1st, PLEASE START USING THE NEW ENVELOPES. Write your name and address on the first few, before we record the number. PLEASE DO NOT ASK OR LOOK FOR YOUR OLD NUMBER.

As of Jan 1st, please **PUT ASIDE ALL YOUR OLD ENVELOPES.** We apologize for this, but there is no other SAFE WAY of distributing the new boxes. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.
