FROM THE DESK OF FR. VITO Greetings parishioners and dear friends of St. Patrick's Church - Wildfield

Beloved friends. Of the many funerals I have celebrated over the years, there is a small phrase used by a young man when eulogizing his father. "A man who always gave 'more' than he had, and always asked for 'less' than he needed." In today's gospel story, the poor widow gave 'all that she had'. In that small gift, she gave her life, her very self. Today we hear expressions such as a "sacrificial giving". In other words, we speak of a gift that is truly a "sacrifice", not simply "something extra that I can easily do without". This leads me to reflect on "how can my gift make a difference". This "difference" we consider in someone else's life. For example, a gift to SHARELIFE. How can it make a difference to those being assisted through the several agencies of ShareLife... and it does make a difference. However, I must also consider HOW DOES IT MAKE A DIFFERENCE IN MY LIFE, in my life as the giver.


If my giving is "sacrificial", then it does make a difference. When I look at the word "sacrifice", I must think of the roots of the words: "Sacrum / holy", "facere/ to do". I do what is holy. This is the gift of the poor widow. She gave all that she had to live on, but the holy aspect of her giving, was the fact that she no longer relied on the little or nothing she had, but she placed all her trust in a loving God.

My question, therefore: In what, or in WHOM do I place my trust? Do my actions, my choice and my commitments witness to the trust I place in my loving God?

CONTINUED CAUTIONS IN OUR JOURNEY OF SAFETY

From the very beginning of the Pandemic, and before we were asked to maintain certain precautions, we have done our very best in reassuring the safety of parishioners and all who join us in prayer. Thanks to the many pandemic volunteers, we have removed all books from the pews; limited seating arrangements, removed holy water containers, but provided holy water bottles to take home. Closed access to the confessionals, and promoted the celebration of the Sacrament in the sacristy. At the very beginning we also removed statues from the church and trained worshippers not to "touch" these devotional icons. We continued to stress the wearing of masks and provided masks for anyone who may have forgotten to bring one. Placed disinfection stations at the entrances to the church. Insisted on NO CONGREGATIONAL SINGING during mass. We limited the time we could spend together in church and did not allow meetings in the church hall. Disinfected the pews after every mass with full cleaning and disinfection every Monday. Further more the church was being sanitized using a UVL fogger on a regular basis.

Some of these lesser measures are slowly being removed as provincial and diocesan guidelines permit.



What else can the parish now do to continue promoting safety for all who attend? This past week, Fr. Vito has met with some parishioners and representatives

from the CITRON HYGENE: building healthy spaces, and two units of air filtrations have been purchased for further safety. These units are engineered to maximize the rate of air changes with the strength to provide purified re-energized air, which filter 99.98% of pollutants, giving us fresh, clean and energized air. These units will be installed in our church in a few days.

THE BARN IN THE PARK



We announced a few weeks ago that due to deteriorating conditions of the structure, we will soon be demolishing it and building a new one. Although

we will be contracting a company for both demolishing and rebuilding, we will still need the help of willing and able bodied parishioners to help out. This will take place in early Spring and we hope that a number of parishioners will come forth to volunteer.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION



Families who have already registered their children for First Confession/First Communion/Confirmation and have already participated with

Fr. Vito in one of two conference calls in September, have started receiving information through social media that will help the children understand the Sacraments. It is suggested that parents view these videos with their children and be involved in a conversation with them. Fr. Vito would appreciate hearing from the parents or children, via email, about their opinion or suggestion with these videos, if you have any questions that arise from the video, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Families who registered and were not able to connect with the conference call have also received information on how they may do so.

Please note that after the Christmas holidays, we will publish the dates for their celebration.
