CONTINUED CAUTIONS IN OUR JOURNEY OF SAFETY

Over the past few days, three units of **AIR FILTRATION** by CITRON HYGIENE have been purchased and placed in the church. Two of them in our liturgical space and one in the church hall. These units are engineered to maximize the rate of air purification, with the strength to provide purified re-energized air, which filters 99.9% of pollutants, giving us fresh, clean and energized air. This, along with the various other measures still in place, and above all, our commitment to prayer, will strengthen our journey through this remaining time of the pandemic. Please continue to be safe and to take care.
