THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near. (Philippians 4:4–5)

Gaudete! Rejoice! The third Sunday of the Advent Season gets its special name from these words of St Paul. Advent is a season of preparing for the coming of the Lord at Christmas, but it is also a reflection of our lives as a preparation to meet the Lord face to face. This preparation, though having penitential aspects, is not meant to be gloomy. We persevere in the face of the challenges that we encounter because we have hope that *the Lord is near*, that He comes to us even now. And so it is right and just to rejoice even in the midst of preparation. And so, halfway through Advent, we ask ourselves: How has your Advent been? Has it been joyful? Are you ready to meet the Lord when He comes?


