We humbly implore the incomparable and unfailing help of Mary, Mother of God and Mother of the Church. We pray that we be endowed with the wisdom and trust to ask for her powerful intercession and the courage to seek her in every distress. May we be ready to welcome all the heavenly graces of divine consolations that her Immaculate Heart obtains for us.

SHORT REFLECTION

From the dogmatic constitution on the Church of the Second Vatican Council
(Lumen Gentium, 62)

This motherhood of Mary in the order of grace—from the consent which she gave in faith at the annunciation, and which she continued to give unhesitatingly at the foot of the cross—lasts without interruption until all the elect enter into eternal fulfillment. When she was taken up into heaven, she did not lay aside this saving role but she continues by her intercession for all to gain for us the gifts of eternal salvation.

In her maternal love she cares for the brothers and sisters of her Son as they journey on earth in the midst of dangers and hardships, until they are brought safely home to the happiness of heaven.

A DECADE OF THE ROSARY – *The Annunciation*

Through your powerful and loving prayers, bring the consolation of Christ our Lord to all the pastors and the entire flock of your Beloved Son, Jesus: to the young and to the elderly, the sick and the abandoned, the lonely and the dejected, those who are to be born and those who are dying, those trying to find their way and those who have strayed away. With a mother’s heart, welcome our petitions and show forth your great compassion and love to those who have become your children entrusted to your motherly care by the Crucified Redeemer.

By your merciful gaze, look upon all those who are persecuted for their faith, the victims of war and abuse, those who are afflicted by addictions, those who despair and have lost all hope. You who are the gift whom our loving Lord gave to us on Calvary, graciously receive our prayer and deny us not the graces we humbly implore from you.

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy,
our life, our sweetness, and our hope.
To you do we cry, poor banished children of Eve.
To you do we send up our sighs,
mourning and weeping in the valley of tears.
Turn then, most gracious advocate,
your eyes of mercy upon us,

R. Look upon Mary and hear our prayer.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, who experienced the cares and hardships of earthly life, the weariness of daily toil, the trials of poverty and the sorrows of Calvary, accompany the Church on its pilgrim journey and in its work of building the Kingdom. *R.*

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, graciously hear the cries of those who implore her goodness for health in mind and body, safety and peace, especially for the Archdiocese of Toronto, our domestic churches and all our communities of faith. *R.*

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, obtain the gifts of knowledge and wisdom for government officials and all who are in positions of authority, that they may carry out the will of God with prudence and justice. *R.*

May the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, pray on our behalf and with us to the Lord of Life and Love, who rules the winds and storms, to calm the tempests in our minds and hearts and bring us unscathed to the shores of our heavenly home. *R.*

Gracious God, you desire that your flock enjoy everlasting life and so you sent your only Son to live as one of us and to guide us home to you. Hear our prayers and those of the Blessed Mother that we might cling to His every word and so, by the Holy Spirit, be transformed into a People after your own heart. We make this prayer through Christ our Lord. Amen.
